Gabriola Presentation to the Nanaimo-Ladysmith School Board

Opposition to Scenario 1 from proposal:
Ensuring Capacity & Safety at NDSS

Cedar School Location

- Not safe for students
 - No active transportation options. (LRFP)
 - Public transportation is limited.
 - Distance compounds and adds stress to situations:
 - illness, school participation and finances for the youth and their parents/caregivers.
- Increased commute times for students
 - Currently the Gabriola students have the longest commute in SD68 and that will be extended.
- Bus in and bus-out community is incorrect
 - Gabriola youth are active in recreation, sport, social and employment which all revolves around the amenities of Nanaimo, not Cedar.
- Access to amenities and support
 - Gabriola youth do not have the same support network proximity, and Cedar will compound that for transportation to medical, dentist and other appointments.

Impacts on Students

- The longer commute will have detrimental effects on:
 - Student learning, ability to connect with peers, opportunities for sport/recreation and employment, as well as time for their families.
- The distance will impact:
 - Their ability to attend school when late or needing to leave for an appointment.
 - The isolation they feel from both their school community and Gabriola.
 - Mental health and wellbeing.
- Participation, Attendance and Graduation:
 - The distance will inhibit students and parents/caregivers from engaging in school activities.
 - Attendance will suffer if students are late or needing to travel to school after the school bus.
 - Graduation and success will be affected due to the logistical challenges this scenario presents.

Impacts on Community

- Retaining and attracting families
 - Gabriola has an average age of 67 yo. With the recent addition of the skatepark and the changes to employment from covid, the island has seen an increase of younger demographics. This will reverse the gains that the community has made.
- Socio-economic strains
 - Over 45% of the Gabriola youth live at or below the poverty line. Many of which in single parent households. The financial challenges that the Cedar scenario would compound would affect monthly budgets and spending in significant ways.
- Labour Force & the economy
 - If Gabriola is unable to retain and attract families, there will be less workers to provide services and the economic impacts would ripple throughout the community
- Connection
 - All Gabriolans have a connection to Nanaimo for services, networks, employment and commerce. From a young age children experience Nanaimo and are familiar with its surroundings. Many of us have NEVER been to Cedar and isolating our youth in this way in a strange community would have far reaching impacts.

We (Gabriola parents/caregivers, students, and community members), the undersigned, are firmly opposed to Nanaimo-Ladysmith SD68 changing the catchment boundaries for Gabriola students to attend Cedar Secondary School. All the reasons listed in below outlines why Gabriola students need to remain at NDSS. We implore that SD68 elected Trustees and staff take a holistic approach to understanding the needs of Gabriola youth and the unique needs of the Gabriola community. Upon further consideration, we believe that SD68 Trustees and staff will come to the conclusion that moving Gabriola students to Cedar Secondary goes against SD68’s vision of “Success for All”.

List of Reasons for Opposing Changing Gabriola Students Catchment to Cedar Secondary School- Prepared by Gabriola Parents

Access to School Location (distance and commute)

1. NDSS is the shortest commute in distance for Gabriola students from the Gabriola Ferry Terminal in Nanaimo (NDSS 2.9 km, John Barsby 3.4 km, Woodlands 4.9 km, Wellington 8.4 km, Cedar Secondary 9.6 km, Dover Bay Secondary 12.8 km). NDSS is their “neighbourhood school” because of accessibility by travel time to school via school bus, walking, city bus, and biking. Note: the SD68 report states that NDSS and Cedar have similar travel times by school bus. This is incorrect information. It takes approximately 8 minutes to drive to NDSS and 15 minutes to drive by school bus to Cedar Secondary.
2. Gabriola youth currently commute by ferry boat to Nanaimo and then by school bus to NDSS. A typical Gabriola high school student begins their day at 6am (depending on their location on Gabriola) and catches the 7:35am ferry. When not participating in extracurricular activities, they return home directly on the 3:10pm school bus for the 3:25pm ferry, which arrives on Gabriola at 3:45pm. The student will then travel home, arriving between 4pm-4:30pm. For most of the year Gabriola students are up before dawn and home after dusk, commuting from home far longer than their NLPs peers.
3. Gabriola students already have an extended commute because of the ferry + school bus to NDSS. Moving Gabriola to Cedar Secondary unfairly extends their commute beyond what is already a long day. Every Gabriola high school student with full attendance for their 5-year high school career will spend a minimum of 128 hours riding the ferry to achieve their Dogwood Diploma. This number does not include wait times for either of the twice daily ferry crossings, ferry delays, or additional travel time from home/school to the ferry terminal.
4. Gabriola youth are pushed into autonomy in grade 8 as they do not have parents or guardians available in Nanaimo to chauffeur them to activities and friends’ houses, or can pick them up from school if sick. This is a unique situation that no other school or community faces within the Nanaimo-Ladysmith School District.

Petition:

Opposing Nanaimo-Ladysmith (SD68) proposal to move Gabriola students to Cedar Secondary

Therefore, public transportation (city bus) and active transport accessibility is essential when considering Secondary School placement for Gabriola students. The SD68 LRFP recommendation #21 supports this and states, "create an active transportation plan for staff and students and ensure that walkable neighborhoods are considered when reviewing catchments."

5. Gabriola students are not strictly a bus-in and bus-out community. Gabriola youth are involved in school-based extracurricular activities and outside-school extracurricular activities. These activities take place after school hours and require students to find their own safe, reliable, accessible transportation when the activities are over. Attending Cedar Secondary will not provide safe, reliable, accessible transportation, (city bus is 50 minutes to 1.5 hours with a bus transfer at VIU with a frequency of one bus per hour, walking is 2-2.5 hours). Currently, Gabriola youth attending NDSS can easily catch frequently scheduled public transportation from NDSS to get to all extracurricular activities and specialty appointments without relying on parents/guardians (city bus is 15-18 minutes, walking is 35 minutes back to ferry if activities are taking place in and around NDSS).
6. Gabriola Elementary School is a school identified as having a high level of child poverty. The socio-economic situation of a student's family does not change when they enter high school. To expect the additional costs of distance bussing, cab or other transportation costs to and from high school rather than a free walkable solution will add to the economic stress of Gabriola families. This is also true for parents/caregivers who attend any school function to support their student. Parents and caregivers would be under significant additional time and cost pressure to attend any teacher conference, school or extracurricular activity based out of Cedar Secondary.
7. Gabriola students who, for any of life's reasons, miss the bus or ferry, will be stranded and their attendance will suffer as a result. Without a direct District school bus, the ability to get to Cedar Secondary is an immense obstacle to overcome for a high schooler. Currently, if a student attending NDSS has a spare block, an appointment or any other reason for a delayed start which results in missing the 7:35am ferry and connecting school bus, they have access to a direct city bus, or their own active transportation to school in the shortest possible time. This would not be possible for Gabriola students attending Cedar Secondary.

Access to Facilities & Extracurriculars (in school and outside of school)

8. Gabriola youth do not have the same access to recreational amenities and facilities from pre-school-grade 7 as their NLPS peers. Once Gabriola youth begin high school, they can participate in many activities and have access to a broader range of facilities. Relocating youth to Cedar Secondary, where there are also limited recreational facilities and social opportunities, will NOT benefit our youth.
9. Currently, Gabriola students have access to: the Nanaimo Aquatic Centre (NAC); ice rink; baseball, soccer and football fields; the Nanaimo track; VIU and its dual credit program for grade 12 students, and many other facilities in North Nanaimo that are easily accessible by bus from NDSS. In particular, access to the pool is of critical importance for youth who live on an island and have not had regular access to a swimming pool or lessons as a life-saving skill. This provides them with the opportunity to catch up to their peers, who have had this as an unencumbered opportunity.
10. Youth recreational and social opportunities are extremely limited once returning to Gabriola and the reality is there is no going home for supper to recharge/reset or exchange school books for sports equipment or other

event supplies, and then back out for an evening activity. Easy access to extracurriculars is very important to Gabriola students when they are already in Nanaimo for school.

11. If Gabriola students attended Cedar Secondary, accessing these same facilities listed above would require an extended commute (see commuting issues above). The lack of accessibility or difficulty to gain access to programs and facilities at Cedar Secondary and surrounding community, will become a deterrent for Gabriola students to participate in extracurricular activities due to the added difficulties of commuting and ease of access that is already available to them at NDSS and surrounding area. This alone does not ensure "Success for All" Gabriola students.
12. Gabriola students who attend NDSS have the option of participating in school-based extracurricular activities. This is vitally important to the health and well-being of Gabriola students who come from a community with a high poverty rate. For many, access to school-based extracurricular activities may be their only means of gaining access to sports, arts, and school clubs. Cedar Secondary has very limited options for extracurricular activities in comparison to NDSS.

Access to Medical Care

13. The Nanaimo Youth Wellness Centre is located at the Nanaimo Aquatic Centre next to NDSS. The proximity of the Wellness Centre is crucial for Gabriola youth because it provides easy access for their medical care needs. Our students do NOT have access to medical facilities on Gabriola Island during the weekdays because they are off island at school from 7:35 am-4:30 pm. The Centre offers drop-in appointments from Tuesday to Thursday and provides sexual health support, mental health support, medical referrals, low-cost birth control, gender identity support, counselling, pregnancy testing, STI testing, and regular doctors appointments.
14. Students based at NDSS have the opportunity to access additional health care appointments (dentistry, optometry, etc.) after school due to the centralized location of NDSS and its proximity to frequent public transit service. Easy access to Nanaimo-based healthcare is a necessity for Gabriola students. The location of Cedar Secondary will severely limit high school students' access to health care.

Access to Student Community & Impact on Gabriola Community

15. Gabriola students attend a small elementary school. When students move to high school, they make new friends and expand their community of peers. Developing new friendships is imperative to our students' health and well-being. Gabriola NDSS students have easy access to their peer networks in Nanaimo because their friends live near the ferry terminal or have frequent and easy access to public transportation. If Gabriola students attended Cedar Secondary there is less independent "hanging out" with new friends who live much further away (again, location and commuting is the reason for this). In fact, students who currently attend Cedar Secondary live in a different Regional District from Gabriola students (Gabriola is Electoral Area B and Cedar is Electoral Area A).
16. There is a small number of Gabriola students who currently attend NDSS (91 students). Moving all Gabriola students will not reduce the student population at NDSS. Currently, Gabriola Elementary School (GES) has 16 grade 7 students preparing to enter grade 8 at NDSS. Moving just the Gabriola grade 8 students to Cedar Secondary will not reduce the current population at NDSS. Even from a 3-year perspective, the number of Gabriola students is small and is NOT the reason why NDSS is/will be operating over capacity. The current

population at GES includes: Grade 7 (16 students); Grade 6 (16 students), and Grade 5 (18 students). In a 3-year period, this would gradually reduce NDSS by 50 Gabriola students which will not solve the over capacity issue at NDSS.

- 17. Moving current Gabriola NDSS students (grade 8-11) to Cedar Secondary will disrupt the health and well-being of Gabriola students who have already established routine, friendships, and roots at NDSS. Moving current Gabriola NDSS students should not be an option for consideration and, again, will not solve the long-range planning issues at NDSS.
- 18. Moving Gabriola students to Cedar Secondary would not just affect the mental/physical health and well-being of Gabriola high school students. Families move to Gabriola because of the proximity to NDSS and easy (accessible) commute (city bus, walking, biking). Moving Gabriola students to Cedar Secondary would have direct repercussions on the Gabriola community at large. Gabriola Elementary school would see a reduction in student population and young families would move away once students are ready to attend high school. The ability to recruit and retain doctors for our increasing and aging population would be directly affected. The realities listed above would directly affect the local economy and workforce, which is already struggling. A decision like moving students from one school to another school will reshape our community in ways that have not been considered by people who don't live on Gabriola Island.

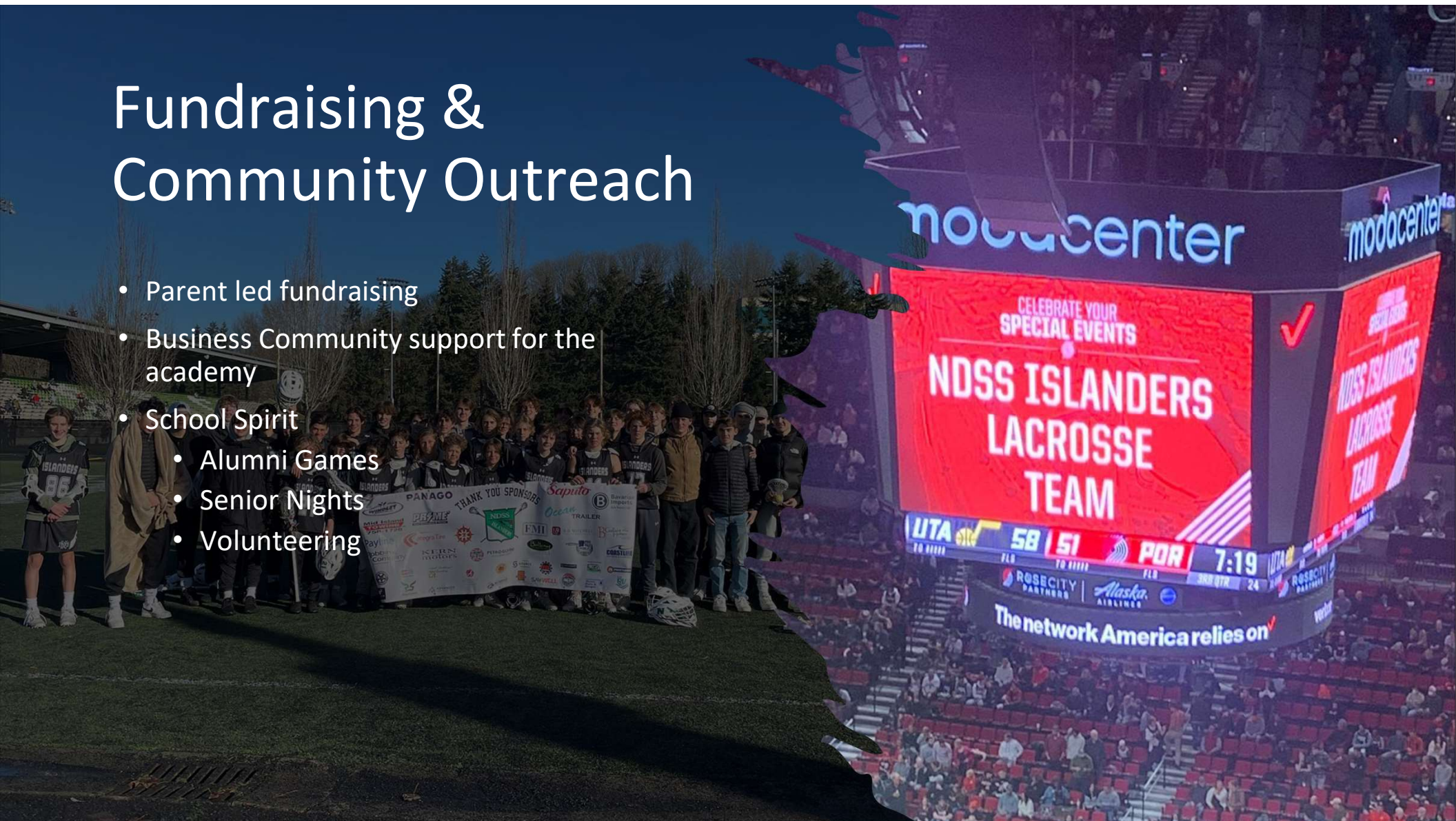

Why Scenario 2 Isn't the Answer: The Costs Outweigh Benefits

- Scholarships placed in jeopardy
- Loss of educational options

- **Loss of extracurricular offerings:**

- Students would no longer have access to the same programs and activities that NDSS offers

- **Detrimental to student mental health & well-being:**

Things to Consider

- 44 Athletes in the academy
- 16 of the 44 are already in catchment for NDSS

- Unfortunately, without prior consultation, it is unknown if all athletes would relocate to Barsby if the lacrosse academy was moved

Our Recommendations

- Move forward with consideration of Scenarios 4 and 5 that will achieve the same temporary outcome without displacement of students
- All future options proposed should be in line with the SD68 Vision, Mission, Values and Goals
- Pursue more consultation with the students and families who are affected by the Board / District plans and recommendations

Thank you for your letter of October 19, 2022, regarding the Board of Education's concerns about crosswalk conditions in Cedar and South Wellington.

Safety is the ministry's highest priority, and we work hard to provide safe crossings for pedestrians throughout our transportation network. You may be aware that the ministry's local contractors have completed repainting all the crosswalks at the intersection of Woobank and Hemer roads, as well as Woobank and Morland roads near the Snuneymuxw Learning Academy. They also repainted the stop bar line at the intersection of Gould and Cedar roads.

Local ministry staff completed a review of crosswalks throughout Cedar, and they confirm that the crossings at the following locations will be included in the maintenance contractor's plan for repainting in 2023:

- Cedar Road and Furn Road;
- Cedar Road and Woobank Road;
- Cedar Road and Yellow Point Road;
- Cedar Road and Gould Road West; and
- Gould Road West at Cedar Elementary School.

Further, ministry staff identified the following additional locations for repainting in 2023:

- the crosswalk at Macmillan Road and Walsh Road;
- the crosswalk at Macmillan Road and Holden Corso Road;
- all crosswalks at Morden Road and South Wellington Road; and
- the stop bar at Cedar Road and Furn Road.



Thank you for your email of January 20, 2023, regarding your support for the seismic replacement and expansion of Nanaimo District Secondary School (NDSS).

Addressing student safety and enrolment pressures are top priorities for the Ministry of Education and Child Care. It is understood that NDSS is the number one priority under the seismic and replacement programs in the District's 2023/24 Five Year Capital Plan submission, which was submitted in June 2022.

The Ministry is reviewing and considering this request, alongside requests for capital funding from British Columbia's other 59 public school districts, with the outcome of the process becoming known following the release of Budget 2023.

On the invitation of Chantelle Morvay, I am writing to you to request your assistance with a matter that we feel strongly requires your attention.

We are part of a group of South End citizens wishing to advocate for safe, universal access to Bayview Elementary school. Our team includes a community occupational therapist, a teacher/PAC parent member and someone with a masters in accessible community development.

We have identified several inaccessible and unsafe street crossings to access the school as well as a dearth of curb cuts and separated sidewalks on Needham street, which has a significant blind crest bidirectionally. As you are aware, these are barriers for school attendees and community members with mobility impairments. We have begun to advocate for much needed infrastructure upgrades to promote safety and universal access. To this end, we have engaged various stakeholders in the area, including the City of Nanaimo, the South End Community Association, the Snuneymuxw Nation, as well as local disability advocates, childcare providers, developers and the Bayview PAC to contribute to this conversation.

We understand that the School Board will have a vested interest in ensuring safe access for school attendees and the community as a whole. We would be very grateful to know of any steps we can take to further this conversation with you, and what role the board could play in our advocacy efforts to promote safe, inclusive pedestrian access. Would you consider meeting with us for a deeper consultation?

Hello school district board,

I hope this letter finds you well and safe.

I am writing to comment on the decision making process for opening/closing of schools. My comments relate to the quality of the student enrollment data that leads to possible strategic decision-making outcomes for these decisions.

I realize school resource planning is complex, but I am finding it hard to figure out how strategic decisions can be made from the data presented.

I applaud the districts decisions to reopen schools.

However, I'd like to point out that you had this data years ago. But, it wasn't presented to you correctly.

I'd encourage the district to hire a data analyst. Given the quality of the graphs below and some of the projected enrollment data presented in the past, I am going to assume there isn't one on staff.

There are 3 points I'd like to make:

#1 Student enrollment data in 2015 actually showed elementary enrollment increasing to 2025. But, instead, decisions based on declining student enrollment were made:

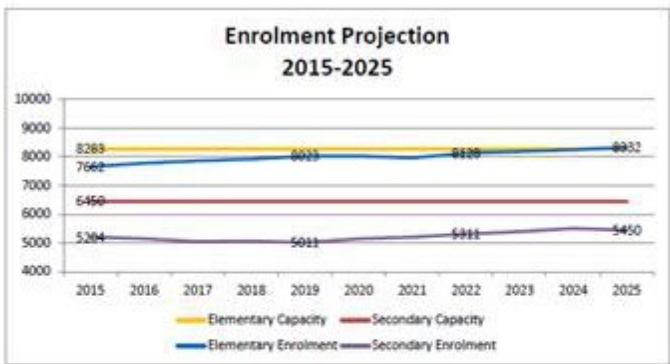
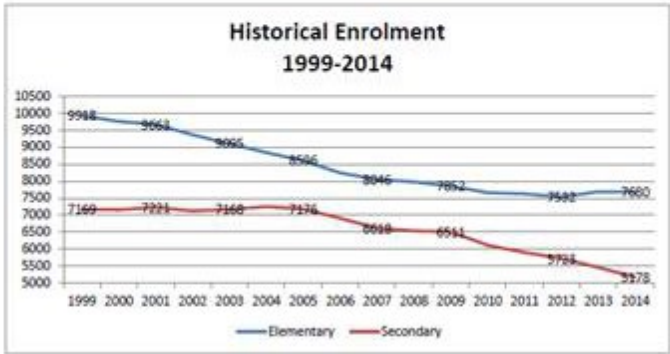
I was in attendance at the 2015 meeting where school closures were tabled and discussed. I was struck by the graphs of current and future enrollment that were presented. I wrote a letter trying to describe why they were misleading (see attached). In fact, they were presented in a way that would go against any science/mathematical standard of practice for graphing.

For the 2015 presentation, my main point was that current and future student enrollment numbers were presented on **2 separate graphs and on 2 different scales at 2 different resolutions** to try and show that student numbers were going to decline in the future.

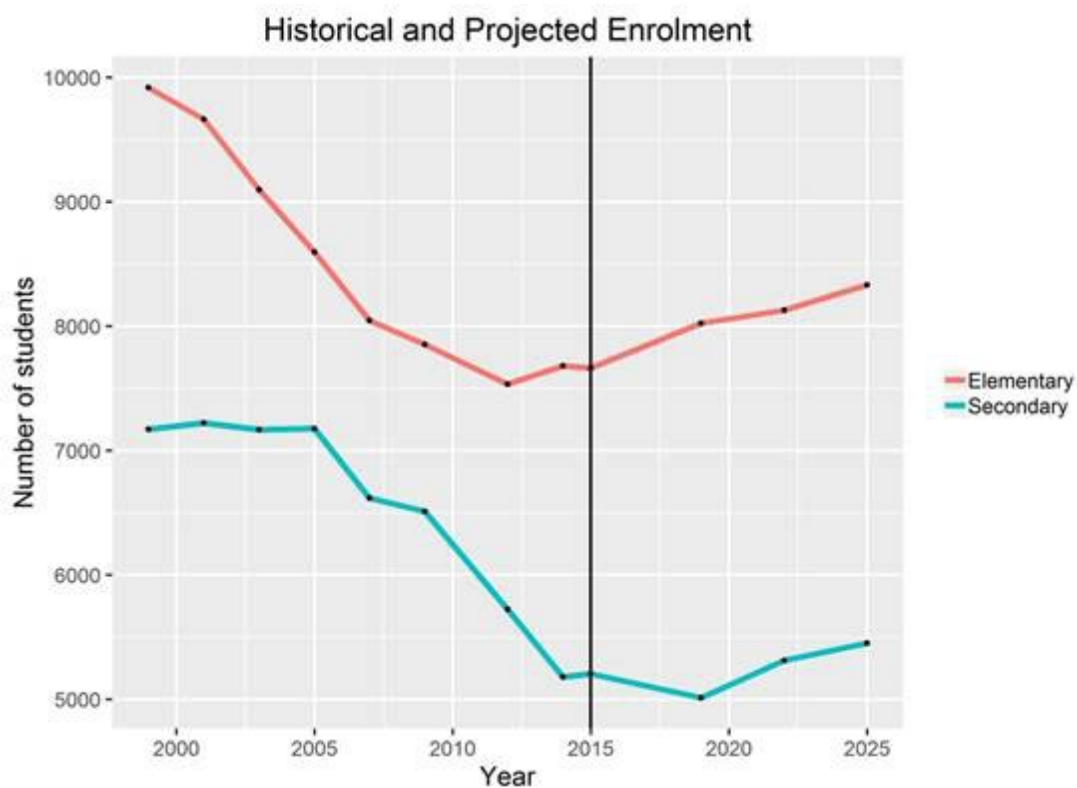
The y-axis scale on the historical enrolment graph is from 5000-10500.

The y-axis scale on the future enrolment graph is from 4000-10000.

Graphs from 2015 facilities plan:



When I used the **SAME** numbers on **ONE** graph:



This second graph shows in fact that numbers are due to increase, not decrease – especially for elementary schools.

I realize there are other factors that contribute to decision-making for school resources, but these graphs are just so glaringly wrong to be used in any meaningful way to make decisions.

#2 Scenario data on future predications would improve ability to make informed decisions.

In the 2015 data above and the new 2021 tables, all of the graphs are missing confidence intervals or something equivalent.

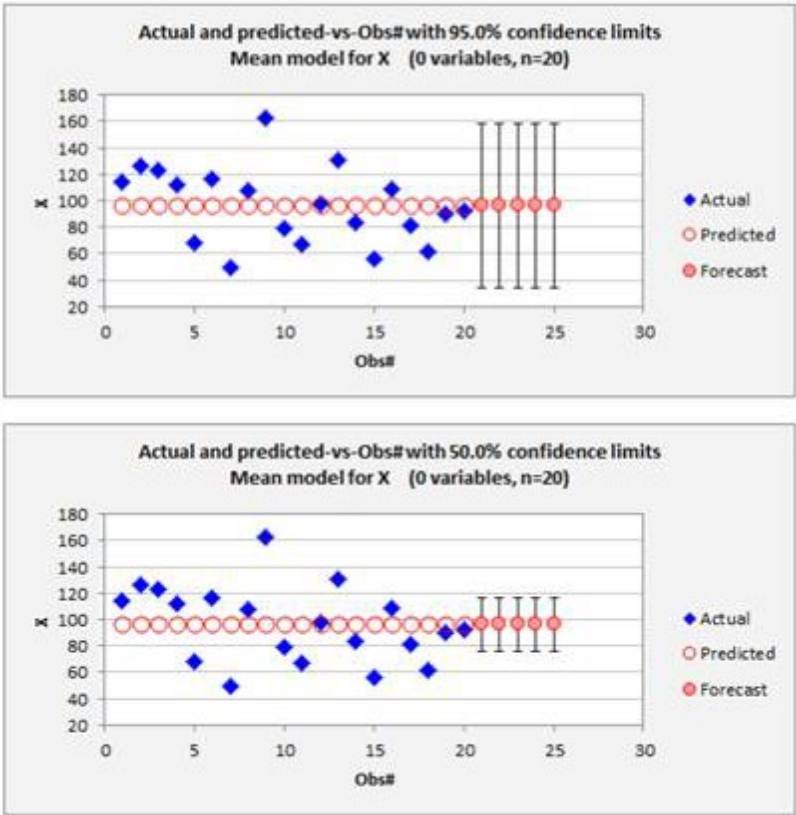
Confidence intervals are a measure of how confident you are in that prediction. Without confidence intervals, you are saying that there is only one possible outcome for future enrollment.

A data analysis would be able to add this information to your data.

In reality, there are many possible outcomes and good planning should encompass several of the more likely student enrollment outcomes.

These example graphs show confidence intervals in the form of vertical lines to say that the real future value could be anywhere between 40 and 160 (top graph) with high confidence or

with less confidence between 80-120 (lower graph):



In the 2021 plan, what is the likelihood that 457 students will be at McGirr school in 2030-31? How confident is that prediction?

Confidence intervals might tell you, for example, that between 430 to 470 students might be present at the school and you can plan for multiple possibilities and then could refine as the time drew nearer.

My suggestion would be to ask the data consultants to supply a range of possibilities for student enrollments and the probability of each one occurring over time. Or, for an in-house analyst to add these.

As a data analyst myself, it would be something I'd expect to be asked if supplying this type of information.

#3 – Has an analysis been done on 'predicted numbers' vs 'actual numbers' of students?

After an enrollment year, is there information that captures what the student enrollment was predicted to be vs. what it actually was? This would give you a good indication of whether or not your enrolment models are working.

Thank you for listening and hope these comments provide good food-for-thought.

That the Board of Education approve the amendment to Minor Capital Bylaw No. 2022/23-CPSD68-02 to read Capital Bylaw No. Capital Bylaw No. 2022/23-CPSD68-03, reflecting the Ministry of Education and Child Care's amendment to the Annual Programs Funding Agreement to supplement our electric Bus(es) purchase and additional funds for charging infrastructure.

Background:

As the Board is aware, the Ministry of Education and Child Care has agreed to provide \$30,000 for each electric bus the District purchases through the Ministry's Bus Acquisition Program and will also provide additional funding for infrastructure/charging stations through the Carbon Neutral Capital Program.

To obtain this funding the District must compete the Minor Capital Plan amendment process. The first step of this process was completed on January 16, 2023, when the Board approved the amendments to the proposed five-year Minor Capital Plan for 22/23 submission. The Ministry has now provided us with an amended Capital Plan Response Letter and Annual Program Funding Agreement, copies of which are attached. The next step in this process is for the Board to approve the amendment to the Bylaw. Once approved by the Board, it will be forwarded to the Ministry for final approval and will allow the District to draw funds for incurred project expenses.

Recommendation:

That the Board of Education of School District No. 68 (Nanaimo-Ladysmith), in accordance with provisions under section 142(4) of the School Act, hereby approves the amended proposed Five-Year Capital Plan (Minor Capital Programs) for 2022/2023, as provided on the Five-Year Capital Plan Summary for 2022/23 submitted to the Ministry of Education and Child Care.

Background:

On January 11, 2023, the Ministry of Education and Child Care agreed to provide \$30,000 for each electric bus the District purchases through the Ministry's Bus Acquisition Program. The additional amount will be automatically revised on the District's current BUS Certificate of Approval. No action is required by the Board to receive this funding.

In addition to the above, the Ministry will provide additional funding for charging and infrastructure/charging stations through the Carbon Neutral Capital Program. This funding can also be utilized towards the funding of the cost of the electric bus(es). The amount supported by the Ministry is \$70,900. To obtain this funding, a few steps are required, starting with the above resolution supporting an official amendment to the capital plan submission. This resolution is required to be attached in the software at the time of the submission – no later than January 18, 2023.

Subsequent to the submission and Ministry approval, the Ministry will send an amended Annual Program Funding Agreement and the Board will be asked to amend the capital bylaw which will reflect the changes and forward it to the Ministry. Once approved by the Minister's designate, the Ministry will then provide final completed, signed copy of the APFA along with the Certificate of Approval allowing the District to draw funds for incurred project expenses.

Funding will assist with the purchase of two zero-emission busses and the installation of charging stations. The supplier indicates that the busses should arrive by February 2023. The stations have been designed and approved for construction and will be operational when the busses arrive.

The Board should forthwith adopt a bylaw setting the School Site Acquisition Charges for the School District, as s. 575(3) of the *Local Government Act* prescribes that a SSAC may only come into effect 60 days (inclusive of weekends and holidays) after that bylaw is adopted by a board of education. At that point, local government may commence the collection of an applicable per dwelling unit charge from residential developers on behalf of a board.

This amended Annual Programs Funding Agreement dated for reference the 19th day of January 2023, is in effect for the 2022/23 fiscal year period of April 1, 2022 to March 31, 2023

BETWEEN: His Majesty the King in Right of the Province of British Columbia,
represented by the Minister of Education (the "Ministry")

OF THE FIRST PART

AND: the Board of Education of School District No. 68 (Nanaimo-Ladysmith) (the "Board")

OF THE SECOND PART.

The parties agree as follows:

1. DEFINITIONS

1.01 In this Agreement, unless the context otherwise requires:

"Agreement" means the Annual Programs Funding Agreement;

"Board" or "Board of Education" means a board of school trustees constituted under the *School Act* [RSBC 1996] c. 412 and any person designated by the Board to act with respect to a provision of this Agreement;

"Business Day" means a day, other than a Saturday or Sunday or Statutory Holiday, on which Provincial government offices are open for normal business in British Columbia;

"Capital Funding Grant" means a funding grant authorized by the Minister of Finance in accordance with section 56.1 of the *Financial Administration Act* [RSBC1996] c. 138;

"Certificate of Approval" means the Certificate of Approval described in paragraph 3.04;

"Eligible Expenditure(s)" means those expenditure(s) areas more particularly described in paragraph 3.01;

"Event of Force Majeure" means invasion, rebellion, hostilities, sabotage, government regulations or controls, acts of God, strikes, lockouts or labour disputes that are a major disabling event or circumstance in relation to the normal operations of the party concerned as a whole that is beyond the reasonable control of the party directly affected and results in a material delay, interruption or failure by such party in carrying out its duties, covenants or obligations under this Agreement;

"Minister" means the Minister of Education, and includes the Deputy Minister of Education and any person designated by either of them to act with respect to a provision of this Agreement;

"Ministry" means the Ministry of Education of the Province of British Columbia;

"Project" means the project(s) described in paragraph 3.01;

"Schools Protection Program" means the risk management program administered and delivered by the Risk Management Branch of the Ministry of Finance in conjunction with the Ministry of Education, and includes the "Schools Protection Program Reference Manual" and all amendments and updates to the program and manual;

"Treasury Board" means the Treasury Board established under the *Financial Administration Act* [RSBC 1996] c. 138.

*Emergent request due to bus being written off following an accident. Total amount funded by Ministry reduced by SPP claim value of \$32,965.57.

3.02 The Ministry will, in no event, provide more than the amount listed above.

3.03 The Ministry will provide the capital funding in paragraph 3.01 in the form of a Capital Funding Grant.

- 3.04 Payment of a Capital Funding Grant is subject to the Ministry issuing a Certificate of Approval for the Project in paragraph 3.01 in accordance with Treasury Board policies and directives and to the following conditions:
- a) in no case may the Board make a draw against funds available under a Certificate of Approval, unless the draw is reimbursement for Eligible Expenditure(s) properly incurred by the Board in connection with the Project;
 - b) the Ministry may modify or withhold a Capital Funding Grant and applicable Certificate of Approval, or any portion thereof, in the event the Board fails to observe, perform and comply with any provision of this Agreement or if, in the opinion of the Ministry, there has been a material change in the Project;
 - c) the Board will comply with all applicable policies and directives of the Treasury Board respecting Capital Funding Grants.
- 3.05 Notwithstanding any other provision of this Agreement, the payment of funds by the Ministry to the Board, pursuant to this Agreement, is subject to the provisions of the *Financial Administration Act* ("the Act"), which makes that payment obligation subject to:
- a) there being sufficient monies available in an appropriation, as defined in the Act, to enable the Ministry, in any fiscal year or part thereof when any payment of money by the Ministry to the Board falls due pursuant to this Agreement, to make that payment;
 - b) Treasury Board, as defined in the Act, not having controlled or limited, pursuant to the Act, expenditure(s) under any appropriation referred to in this subparagraph a).

4. BOARD OBLIGATIONS

- 4.01 The Board will:
- a) carry out the Project in a manner that ensures:
 - i) delivery within budget;
 - ii) completion by March 31, 2023;
 - iii) scope details are fully met upon completion;
 - iv) accrued cost-savings realized from completed capital projects as approved in this Agreement are reported to the Ministry and transferred into the school district's Minister-Restricted Capital account, unless otherwise agreed to in writing by the Ministry.
 - b) comply with all policies and best practices related to Capital Project Procurement, as documented in the Capital Asset Management Framework and Capital Procurement Checklist published by the Ministry of Finance;
 - c) procure the Project in accordance with the Capital Asset Management Framework;

- d) include in any contracts all standard insurance and indemnification clauses required by the Schools Protection Program;
 - e) ensure all communication related to the Capital Project conforms to the “Communications Protocol Agreement on Minor Capital Projects between the Ministry of Education and School Districts” (provided as Schedule A). Note this protocol may be amended from time to time by the Ministry, with the most current version of the protocol being used.
- 4.02 Provide written notice to the Ministry of Education immediately upon completion of each Project. (Note: the Ministry will be following up with school districts regarding delayed and/or incomplete projects in early January, at which time the Ministry may choose to reallocate associated funds depending on the status of the Project).
- 4.03 At the request of the Ministry, prepare additional reports relating to the Project.
- 4.04 Notify the Ministry immediately, in writing, should any Event of Force Majeure arise that could materially affect the scope, costs or schedule of the Project.
- 4.05 Indemnify and save harmless the Province of British Columbia and its employees and agents from and against any losses, claims, damages, actions, causes of action, costs and expenses that the Province of British Columbia or any of its employees or agents may sustain, incur, suffer or be put to at any time, either before or after this agreement ends, which are based upon, arise out of or occur, directly or indirectly, by reason of, any act or omission by the Board or by any of its agents, employees, officers, directors, or contractors with respect to the Project.
- 4.06 Purchase school buses through the Request for Standing Offer (RFSO) portal available through the Association of School Transportation Services of BC (ASTSBC).
- 4.07 Reserve two (2) percent of the Total Funding amount provided under the Bus Acquisition Program in paragraph 3.01 as fee payment for ASTSBC’s administration services. The ASTSBC will invoice the Board once buses have been ordered. This fee is included in the Capital Funding Grant and is not an additional cost to the Board.

5. EVENT OF FORCE MAJEURE

- 5.01 In the Event of Force Majeure:
- a) the Board will immediately notify the Ministry, in writing, describing the Event of Force Majeure.
 - b) within five (5) Business Days of being notified of the Event of Force Majeure, the Ministry will communicate with the Board to explore what steps are to be taken to mitigate the Event of Force Majeure, determine an appropriate course of action, and establish an estimated cost related to the Event of Force Majeure.
 - c) the course of action must be agreed to by the Ministry and the Board.
 - d) either party may request the assistance of an independent cost consultant

appointed by mutual agreement of the parties.

- e) the Ministry will not approve any expenditure(s) incurred prior to the agreed course of action unless the costs were demonstrably incurred for the preservation of life and/or safety.

6. PUBLIC ANNOUNCEMENTS

- 6.01 Any public announcement relating to the Project will be in accordance with the “Communications Protocol Agreement on Minor Capital Projects between the Ministry of Education and School Districts” (provided as Schedule A).

7. NOTICE

- 7.01 Any notice or communication required or permitted to be given under this Agreement will be in writing and will be considered to have been sufficiently given if delivered by hand or electronic transmission to the physical address or electronic mail address of each party set out below:

SCHEDULE A

COMMUNICATIONS PROTOCOL AGREEMENT ON MINOR CAPITAL PROJECTS BETWEEN THE MINISTRY OF EDUCATION (EDUC) AND SCHOOL DISTRICTS

News Release

Upon issuance of Capital Plan approvals and funding agreements to school districts, EDUC will issue public news releases regarding minor capital projects. School district(s) may be requested to provide a quote from a designated representative for such news releases.

Signage

Significant, high-profile minor capital construction projects and/or initiatives approved in the EDUC Capital Plan **may** be requested to be identified by signage prominently displayed at the site. EDUC will notify a school district(s) if this is the case.

If requested, signs must conform to Government of B.C.'s Infrastructure Sign Specifications and be produced by Government Communications and Public Engagement (GCPE) graphics department. In addition to the BC logo, school districts and other funding partners will be identified with their logos on signage. Signs are to be installed as soon as possible after announcement of the project, and amended to include the amount of investment and date of completion after award of the contract and preferably before the start of work. The signs are to remain on the site until the work is completed and after any completion ceremonies where applicable. A digital picture of the sign is to be sent to GCPE after it has been installed. Cost of the sign is to be funded from the approved project budget. School districts are responsible for installing the signs.

The steps from signage design to installation are as follows:

1. Project is announced;
2. GCPE will have their graphics department create a construction sign;
3. GCPE graphics department will create and send the approved file to Kings Printer for print production;
4. Kings Printer will notify GCPE when the sign is ready;
5. GCPE will notify the school district(s) when the sign is ready to be ordered and provide them with the online requisition form: <http://brokerage.qp.gov.bc.ca/submit-print/print-form.aspx>;
6. The school district(s) orders, pays and arranges for the sign to be installed. Signs are to be post mounted in a visible location;
7. School district(s) will notify GCPE when the sign is installed and send photo as confirmation.

Official Ceremonies

EDUC will notify a school district(s) if an official ceremony **may** be held to commemorate the launch and/or ground-breaking for a project. The parties shall co-operate in the organization ceremonies, and messages and public statements for such events should be mutually agreed upon.

Plaques

EDUC **may** request the district provide and install (upon completion of significant, high-profile construction projects and/or initiatives), a plaque bearing an appropriate inscription. The design, wording and specifications of such plaques must be approved by EDUC. Cost of the plaque is to be funded from the approved project budget.



Overview:

- SD68 was 1 of 6 pilots district for the Equity in Action Plan.
- Currently, all school districts are participating and are at different points of participation. Some districts are invested in an annual review cycle of their work, where other districts are just beginning to identify goals and writing their first reports.
- SD68 has the highest percentage increase in graduation rates compared to the other pilot districts.

Student Voice Meeting

February 8, 2023

Discussion Topic: JEDI

Highlights:

- Positive examples:
 - Teachers who reach out directly to students creates a sense of connection
 - Being inclusive can be as simple as asking a student what they need
 - Students want to be given the benefit of the doubt
 - Distraction doesn't mean they don't care about what is happening in class, they could be trying to self-regulate
 - Could look like being welcomed to the class when they arrive instead of being asked why they are late
 - Using discrete ways of finding out student pronoun preferences, so they don't feel singled out
- Students want us to know
 - We should celebrate the successes of non-mainstream schools more
 - Show students how to enter their preferred names in MyEd
 - Students want us to empower them
 - Share with them what their rights are as a student
 - Show them how and where they can speak up when they see something that isn't right – whether it is about an adult or another student
 - There needs to be a clear understanding of invisible versus visible disabilities by the adults around them
 - They don't want to feel penalized for things like handwriting when they can tell you more about what they know without a pen
 - Want pronouns normalized; ideas included using pronouns to say “here” when doing attendance
 - Being singled out when late makes students not want to show up at all
 - Students need safe adults at school because they are often not out at home
 - Need to be provided a safe way to report concerns
 - Without fear of reprisal
 - Receive follow up after making a report
 - Safe reporting could mean their IEP needs can be met without resistance
 - Raise awareness related to reporting, i.e., How To
 - Disclosure can mean feeling unsafe and/or unheard

Theme:

- Communication
 - This is the key to succeeding
 - Student awareness of reporting methods
 - Sharing school successes with the public and rest of the district
 - Supporting professional development so that staff communicate in ways that embrace JEDI
- Knowledge
 - To meet student needs related to JEDI, we need to reduce the gap between the

students and top decision makers

- Create a widespread understanding of what a neurodivergent student might look like; reduce the assumption that a student is being disruptive
- Students recommend a diversity audit: Who are we as students? Do school resources reflect who we are? (Books, supports, clubs)
- Poverty
 - Recognize this barrier exists in every school
 - Communicate directly with students, not just newsletters to parents, about financial supports that are available (i.e., ways to cover sports fees)
 - Utilize sports to connect students to school; this can reduce an impoverished student's isolation from their peers
