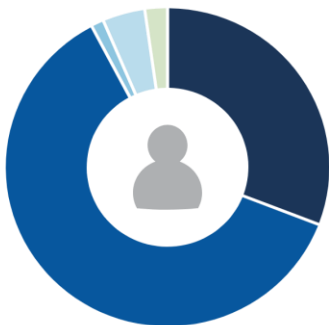

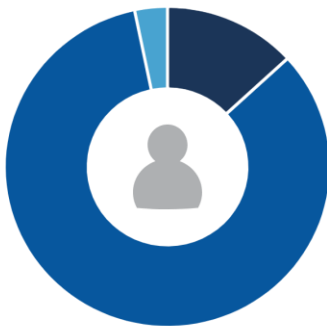

In which region do you reside?

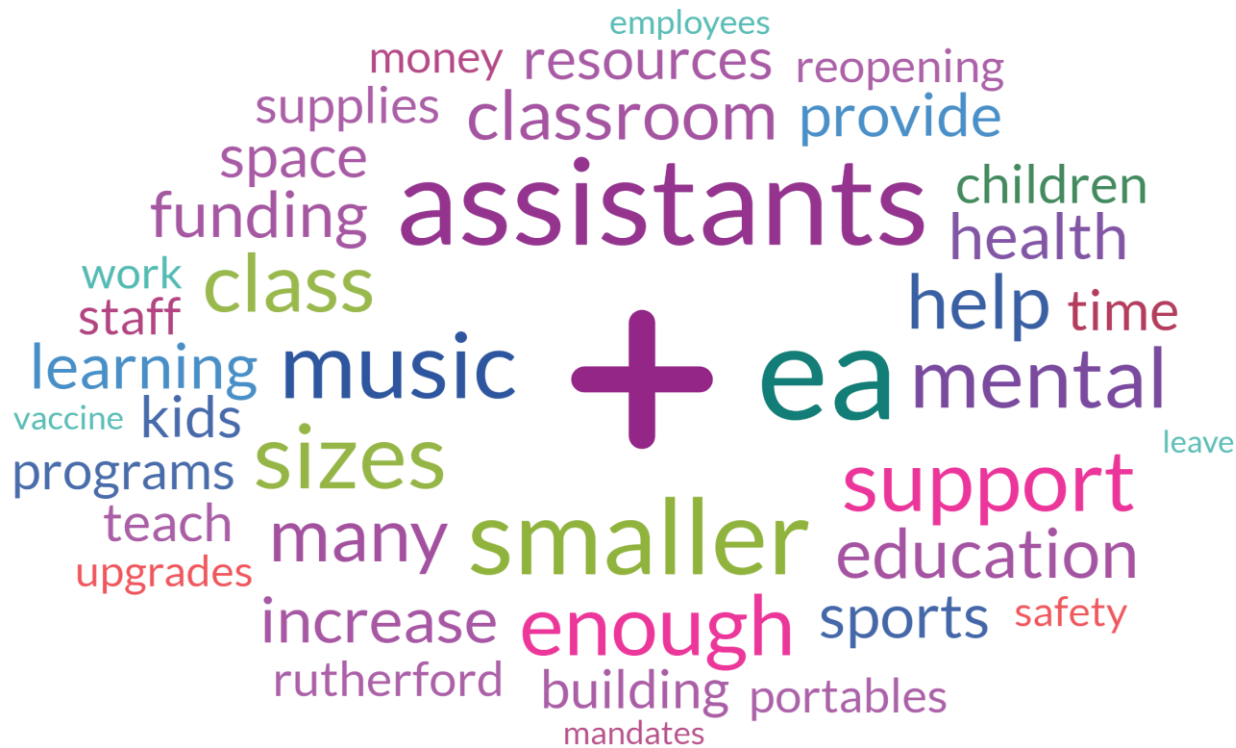

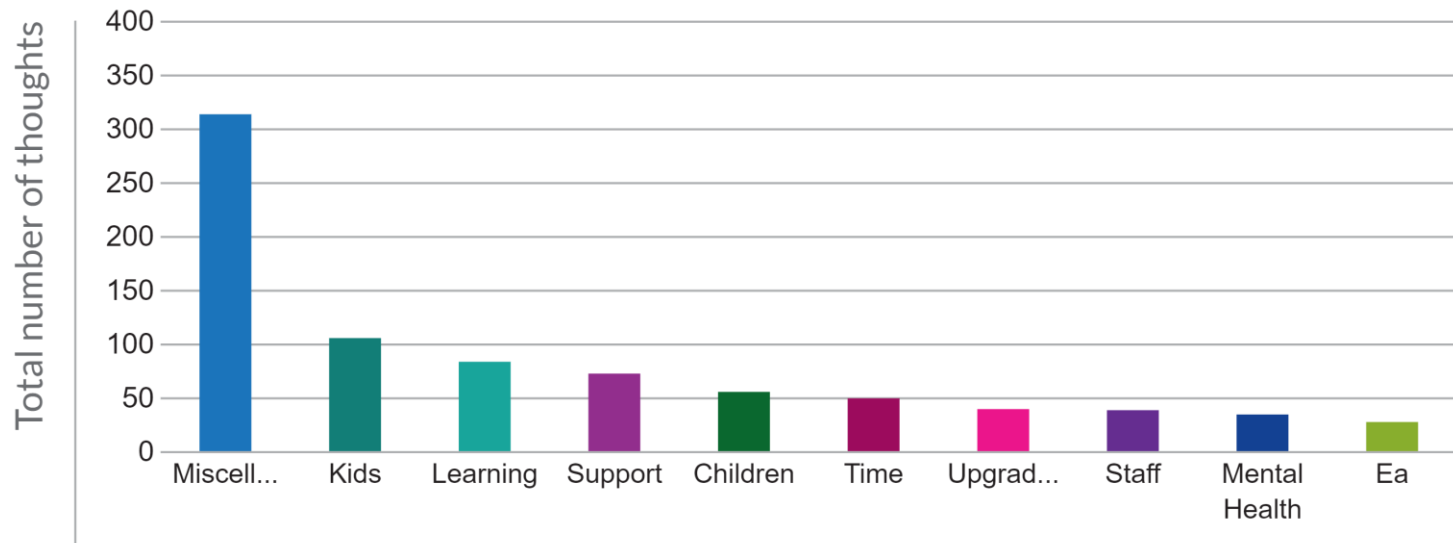

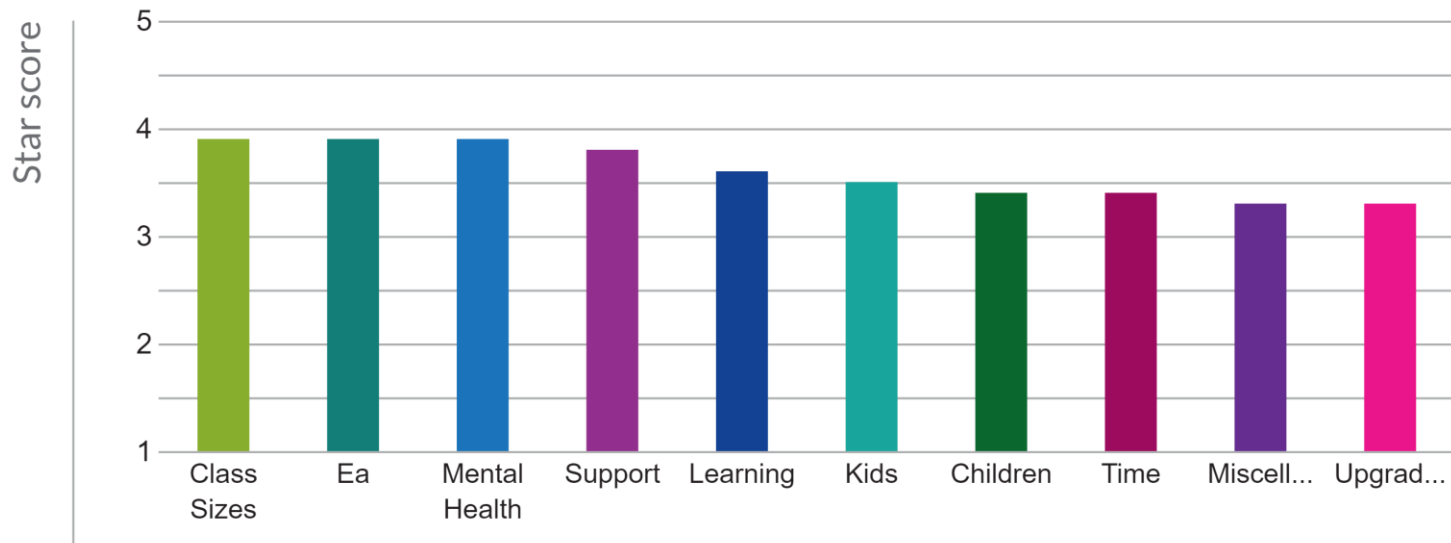
Top Themes by total thoughts
