I believe that Part 2 of the Naming of facilities or parts of facilities could be amended to reflect the dynamically-changing culture and society we live in with respect to historical figures or noteworthy members of the community who have acted or behaved contrary to contemporary societal acceptance.

This could be accomplished for example by being pro-active adding a Part 2(g) with wording to include consultation with submissions from the general public for input into specific name changes.

The submissions should be confidential in nature.

The goal would be to protect Nanaimo-Ladysmith Public Schools from not only making a significant error but also protect students, staff, and the public from any emotional trauma due to events not public.

A specific example of this came up during conversation. Naming a school after an abuser whose victim or victims have been reluctant or afraid to come forward, or who are not ready to come forward at this point in their lives-- this would be unfortunate.

To name a facility after one's abuser would be traumatic for an individual, and to a lesser extent put the school district on the spot for having to re-name a facility.

First of all, when it comes to trustee remuneration, I question whether it makes fiscal sense to have their salary indexed to the cost of living using the Vancouver Consumer Price Index. Instead, I believe that it would make more sense to have it indexed to the cost of living in Victoria or even lower to be more fair and accurate. This would also save the district some money as the cost of living is much higher in Vancouver.

Secondly, I feel that the wording of "Sufficient funds shall be set annually to allow an individual Trustee at his/her discretion to participate in conferences or meetings which provide personal development in the area of education" is too vague. I would like to see a cap put on this amount.
