# SAFETY AND TRAFFIC PROPOSAL

Frank J Ney Elementary

### **Purpose**

To bring awareness and open the dialogue between stakeholders, to create an action plan to prevent accidents, protect, and provide a safer passage for students, pedestrians, and traffic around Frank J Ney Elementary School.

#### **Document Overview**

The following document outlines the concerns and recommendations of many concerned residents residing on Carriage and Entwhistle Drives located adjacent to Frank J Ney School. It is intended to provide information from the past and solutions for the future, to help define viability of change, critical safety details and the necessary risk mitigation measures.

The intended audiences for this document are the stakeholders outlined within.

The information contained within is accurate based on the information known at the date of proposal.

#### Introduction

This proposal is created by the neighbours and concerned individuals in the community surrounding "Frank J Ney" Elementary School, specific to residences on Entwhistle and Carriage Drive. This proposal is the result of multiple years of complaints, petitions, and interactions with city, school and PAC that have gone unresolved. Our group has adopted a more action approached demonstration to draw attention to our past concerns, and advocate for change in a timely manner that will address and provide solutions for the safety of all stakeholders.

The intended areas of interest are specific to Entwhistle Drive as exited from Hammond Bay Rd., Carriage Drive, and the congestion on Williamson Rd. during student pick up and drop off times.

The safety of our children, students, pedestrians, drivers, neighbours, and homeowners is our primary concern. As residents, we have witnessed multiple traffic infractions that have jeopardized the safety of these stakeholders.

There has been a lack of respect by some parents to homeowners on Carriage Drive that has impeded the movements of homeowners and damaged their property. All are explained in "Problem Statement"

#### **Previous Actions**

- Petitions signed and presented to the City of Nanaimo 2019
- Car counter, and speed trap requests-2019
- Meetings and dialogue with Jamie Rose –no follow up provided by City.
- Homeowners contacting City with direct complaints Historical and ongoing
- Homeowner and Parents reaching out to the Frank J Ney School with direct complaints
- Discussion with school representatives when the school was being built

#### Problem Statement

During drop off and pick up times for students attending Frank J Ney school, the following traffic infractions, safety incidents, and lack of marked parking areas has created the following safety issues.


- Speeds of drivers observed as being more than the regulated speed limits both in a school zone and within a traffic congested area.
- Parked cars in "No Stopping Areas"
- U-turns at the base of Entwhistle Drive hill on a blind hill for drivers travelling towards Hammond Bay Road.
- Parked cars on both sides of Entwhistle Dr. forcing students, parents, and pedestrians to walk up the middle of the street on Entwhistle hill.
- Traffic narrowed to one lane forcing drivers to approach oncoming traffic on a blind hill on Entwhistle Drive.
- Traffic narrowed to one lane restricting drivers to turn left from Hammond Bay onto Entwhistle Dr.
- Cyclist exiting the Walley Creek Trail walkway from Frank J. Ney School blindly into oncoming traffic on Entwhistle Drive.
- Parked cars in front of fire hydrants
- Parents picking up students blocking driveways and movements of homeowners on Carriage Drive.
- Parents parking in homeowner driveways and leaving vehicle for extended periods of time to pick up students
- Parents parking in a congested "no exit" street which lacks a defined turn-around space and backing up to turn around, impeding the passage of pedestrians and endangering individuals including students.
- Parents parking on homeowner's lawns and damaging homeowners' property
- Non designated parking stalls at "Harry Whipper Park" parking lot narrows the amount of available parking
- Parking by parents within the drive through drop off areas of school parking lot
- Blocked visibility on West side of street on Williamson at school entrance endangers
  drivers attempting to turn both left and right as they exit from the Frank J. Ney School
  parking lot-ripple effect- slows down drive through area of parking lot.
- Students crossing Williamson Road adjacent to the entrance/exit of Frank J Ney School.
- Disruption of scheduled Recycling/Garbage removal, along with Canada Post mailbox delivery.

#### Benefit Statement

Our goal is to bring awareness to, and hopefully open the dialogue between all stakeholders, to create an action plan so that change can happen in a timely matter, prevent accidents, protect, and provide a safer passage for students, pedestrians, and traffic. Recommendations for more productive "drop off and pick up" areas that offers safety, convenience, and timely movements. Encourage a respectful attitude for the neighbours and homeowners within the Frank J Ney school culture.

#### Stakeholders

This proposal provides recommendations for the "Direct" stakeholders. However, every action will in some way influence the "Indirect" stakeholders now and in the future. These recommendations are with these individuals and groups in mind.



# Summary of Proposed Recommendations

The following recommendations are ones that are actionable by multiple agencies, with minimal costs and within a reasonable period. These recommendations come with documented pictures, videos, and advice from agencies.

## Reflecting the Past and Embracing the future

Parents create "student drop off and pickup" habits based upon their personal schedules, school learning times, and ease of movement that facilitate the quickest routes and reduce the time devoted to these activities. In some instances, parents are practicing unsafe traffic maneuvers, committing traffic infractions, creating unsafe conditions for students and pedestrians, and acting in a disrespectful manner towards homeowners living near the school. These practices have been perpetuated year after year and are now accepted as "normal" practice. While parents move on when their child leaves Frank J. Ney school, new students arrive to take their place and the issues outlined above continue with a new set of parents to the dismay of those of concerned with safety.

Projected population growth over the next ten years may mean an increase in the student population of Frank J. Ney School. If specific plans about improving student and pedestrian safety and reducing the traffic associated issues outlined in this document are not resolved now, they will only be exacerbated in the future. We are of the hope that it will not take a serious accident to force the changes we wish to see take place now.

#### Action Plan

Our "Action Plan" does not end with the submission of our proposal. We have individuals who will serve as point of contact for moving forward, knowing our Action plan is a working document as more agencies are advised of our recommendations. This proposal dove's tails with the points made in the 2018 Safety Traffic Program which was developed without the input of the neighbouring residents of the Frank J Ney School. To date none of the issues stated in our proposal has been addressed or resolved.

With the support of the involved stakeholders, we will be happy to take a step back from our demonstration when we see actions, or commitments from- parents, School District representatives, and the City of Nanaimo. We want to help create, follow up and implement changes that align with our recommendations. Together as a cohesive group of stakeholders we look forward to accomplishing these goals so that the **SAFETY** of our students, pedestrians, and local traffic and the respect toward the neighbourhood are the highest priority.
